# GUEST ACCESSIBILITY GUIDE

## Welcome to White Water Bay!

We are glad you are here! At White Water Bay, we are proud to have earned one of the best safety records in the industry. We are committed to providing our Guests with a safe environment and we want our Guests to have a safe and enjoyable day. We strive to continuously improve our facilities.

Many amusement park rides incorporate safety systems designed by the manufacturer to accommodate people of average physical stature and body proportion. These safety systems may place restrictions on the ability of an individual to safely experience the ride. Guests of larger or smaller size, Guests who have a history of heart, back or neck trouble, Guests who are pregnant, Guests who have had recent surgery, or Guests with casts, braces, restrictive devices, or disabilities may not be safely accommodated by these systems. For example, height requirements are based on the size needed for the safety restraints to function properly and the level of maturity usually associated with a certain height.

The Attraction Accessibility Program has been developed using our past experiences and our evaluation of each ride in both normal and emergency operating conditions. We also work closely with the manufacturer of each ride and our policies incorporate the manufacturers' guidelines as well as the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act. We hope that this Guide will help Guests make the best choices to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience at the park. Our goal is to safely and efficiently accommodate the needs of all Guests, including individuals with disabilities.

Our prime consideration is the ability of each person to endure the dynamics of an attraction without risk of injury to that person or other participants. If you have a suggestion for an improvement or have questions not answered in this brochure, please stop at the Front Desk. If you feel that you or a member of your party may be affected by this policy, you are encouraged to visit the Front Desk to obtain a list of attractions you can safely enjoy. Your Rider Access Form will provide information for our Associates to help accommodate you.

## PLEASE PARTICIPATE SAFELY

While all amusement attractions have associated risks, certain individuals are at increased risk for injury from these attractions. Carefully evaluate each attraction to determine if you or members of your party can safely participate. We reserve the right to deny access to a ride to anyone who we feel may not be able to safely experience the ride or may be a hazard to other participants.

A Safety Guide sign is posted at every ride entrance and Alternate Access entrance. These signs provide height requirements, health restrictions, ride ratings, ride accessibility, and special instructions regarding the ride. Please review these signs prior to accessing the ride and ensure to follow all instructions provided.

In general, all Guests should be in good health and free from any conditions known or unknown that might be aggravated by riding. If you have any doubt about your ability to safely experience a ride, we urge you to consult with our staff at White Water Bay. Remember, if you suspect your health could be at risk for any reason, or you could aggravate a pre-existing condition of any kind, **do not ride!**

Generally, Guests must have the ability to brace themselves upright in their seat and support their head and neck during the ride movements. Guests using wheelchairs will have to transfer from their wheelchair to the ride unit by themselves or assisted by a member of their party in order to be able to ride. You should plan your visit with someone who can physically help you when necessary.

As a Guest, you are responsible for your own safety. Please read this guide and all instructional signage before riding. Listen to and follow all operator instructions. Any person who intentionally removes a safety restraint, violates a park safety policy, or appears to be under the influence of alcohol or chemical intoxicants will be removed from the park without refund. **For your safety, do not enter an unauthorized area for any reason.** You may be seriously injured if you enter an unauthorized area.






**Before riding, please note all safety warnings for each attraction. In general:**

- Follow all proper Rider positioning until the ride comes to a complete stop.
- Due to the nature of our rides, backpacks, purses, electronics, stuffed animals, jewelry, and other loose items are not permitted on most attractions. White Water Bay is not responsible for lost or stolen items. You are responsible for your personal property.
- No picture taking, cell phone, or electronic usage while participating.
- Finish food and drink before boarding.
- Smoking, including e-cigarettes, is not permitted in White Water Bay.

## WHITE WATER BAY RIDE RATING SYSTEM


A Ride Rating System has been designed which provides a scale for rating the thrill factor of each attraction. The intent is to provide a scale to guide park Guests in determining which attractions to ride based on their own experience level, physical condition, and abilities.

**Each attraction is placed into one of five categories:**

CATEGORY	DESCRIPTION
<b>Low Thrill Rides</b>	 This is a low-speed and/or shallow water attraction.
<b>Mild Thrill Rides</b>	 This is a low to medium speed attraction and/or its water depth is up to 48 inches. Some Rider control, maneuvering, and/or swimming skills required.
<b>Moderate Thrill Rides</b>	 This is a medium-speed attraction. Height and water depth may vary. Moderate or unexpected forces can be generated during the ride. This attraction may require Rider control and/or strong swimming skills. Physical activity may be strenuous.
<b>High Thrill Rides</b>	 This is a fast-paced ride experience. Riders will encounter changes in speed, direction, elevation, strong water currents, and/or depth of water, some of which is unexpected. This attraction requires Rider body control and strong swimming skills.
<b>Aggressive Thrill Rides</b>	 This is a high-speed and/or deep water attraction with turbulent turns, drops, and/or strong water currents with changes in speed, direction, elevation, and/or deep water, which may be unexpected. This attraction requires Rider body control and swimming skills.

## ACCESS SYMBOLS

Symbols indicate boarding procedures for each ride and are defined below.



This symbol is used to identify attraction where Guests may remain in their wheelchair.



This symbol identifies attractions that can accommodate Guests who are able to transfer from the wheelchair to the ride unit by themselves or assisted by a member of their party.



This symbol identifies where Guests must be able to walk independently or be assisted by a member of their party.

## DEFINITIONS

Every attraction entrance lists height requirements and special instructions regarding the ride. White Water Bay uses the following terms:



**Ability to hold on or brace:** Ability to use one's arms to maintain a grasp on an assist bar and support one's body during normal and emergency procedures on a ride and to use one's legs to brace to maintain a seated position during the forces of the ride.



**Hand-held Infant:** Hand-held infants are children who are unable to independently walk or maintain seated postural control and will only be able to ride the following rides with a Supervising Companion: Tak-It-Eesi Creek, Lott-A-Watta Bay, and Tip-A-Kanu Beach. Hand-held infants and their Supervising Companion may also enjoy Tall Timbers Treehouse but may not participate on the elevated sections of the attractions.



**Supervising Companion:** A Supervising Companion is someone who meets all the requirements to ride the ride themselves, who is at least 54" in height, and demonstrates appropriate observed behavior. Supervising Companions are responsible for ensuring that the accompanied Rider remains seated properly where applicable and follows all rules and regulations. The Supervising Companion must be seated next to the Rider who needs accompaniment and can accompany one participant. Exceptions to this include Wave Pools and Activity Pools where a Supervising Companion may accompany two participants.

## HEALTH RESTRICTIONS



Each ride is evaluated against five primary health restrictions. These restrictions are:

- Back Trouble
- Heart Trouble/High Blood Pressure
- Neck Trouble
- Pregnancy
- Recent Surgery

If you are in doubt about your ability to safely experience an attraction or would like more information, please review the information for each attraction in this Guest Accessibility Guide or review the Safety Guide and all warning signs posted at each attraction entrance and Alternate Access Entrances.

## PREGNANCY

Guests who know or believe they may be pregnant should follow all rules, guidelines, and restrictions listed for each attraction. Those who are pregnant should not ride a ride that specifically lists pregnancy as a participation restriction. Please closely review all rules and guidelines at the entrance of each attraction.

Guests who are pregnant may participate in Tip-A-Kanu Beach.

## HEIGHT REQUIREMENTS

Height requirements and specific instructions are posted at the entrance to each attraction. Height measurements are taken in bare feet.

To accurately measure Guests, a height-measuring device may be used during the height-measuring process. This device may come into contact with the Guest's head for a brief period.

## LIFE JACKETS

Life jackets are available for all Guests. Only Coast Guard approved life jackets are allowed as floatation devices. Life jackets are provided free of charge for Guests who require one.

In wave pools, life jackets are required for Guests who are less than 52" tall in bare feet, participants with a history of seizures (or similar medical conditions), heart conditions, or those who are inexperienced or non-swimmers. Children who are less than 42" tall must wear life jackets and be accompanied by Supervising Companions. This policy will be enforced at Tak-It-Eesi Creek.

## CASTS & BRACES

Guests with casts and braces will be restricted from riding rides where the cast or brace will not fit inside the ride unit or where it will present a hazard to the Guest or others. Guests with full arm (elbow restricted) and full leg (knee restricted) casts or braces are restricted from most rides and water slides. We suggest you delay your visit until the cast is removed. Casts and braces with exposed metal parts are not permitted on most slides in White Water Bay.

The following chart displays the cast and brace rules for all rides and attractions.

- Y** May ride with the condition
- Z** Participation or water depth may be restricted if necessary

## PROSTHESES

Guests with prostheses that do not have any exposed metal parts are generally permitted on all waterpark attractions. Please consult with a member of the Aquatics Supervisory Team prior to riding to ensure that you have a safe riding experience.

## ONGOING LIFEGUARD TRAINING

In an ongoing effort to provide a safe and enjoyable waterpark experience for our Guests, White Water Bay routinely utilizes training exercises to improve our lifeguards' skills and vigilance. These exercises will occur during normal operating hours and may consist of the following: submersible water manikins, the use of video surveillance equipment, internal and external audits, and active/inactive water rescues and/or First Aid scenarios.

## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Our goal is to make White Water Bay as enjoyable and barrier-free as practical. Listed below are some of the services we offer. Please feel free to suggest areas in which we might improve in the future.



### Braille & Print Guest Accessibility Guides

Print versions of the Park Guide and Guest Accessibility Guide are available at Front Desk Braille and large print versions are also available. There are a limited number of print guides which are obtainable on a first-come, first-served basis.



### First Aid

Our First Aid Station located in White Water Bay is staffed from park open to park close. Medical equipment storage and refrigeration for Guests with medication is offered at First Aid.



### Parking

Accessible parking is available on a first-come, first-served basis within the main parking lots of the hotel. When you arrive at the parking toll booths, ask an Associate for instructions regarding where to proceed to the accessible parking lot. Both auto and van accessible spaces are provided. A valid disabled persons parking placard or license plate must be displayed at all times while parked in the designated accessible parking area. If the designated accessible parking area is full at the time of your arrival, members of your party may be dropped off at the main pick-up/drop-off area, near the main entrance to the park. Proper vehicle identification must be displayed. Security Officers on duty are authorized to ticket and/or tow vehicles that do not display proper identification. Please ask an associate for directions to additional parking areas.



### Restrooms

Private restroom facilities for Guests needing the assistance of a Companion are available in White Water Bay. Wheelchair accessible stalls are located at all restrooms. For your convenience we also have a family restroom available in White Water Bay.



### **Service Animals**

Service animals are welcome at White Water Bay. A service animal is defined as a dog that has been individually trained to do work or perform tasks for a person with disabilities. Examples of such work or tasks include guiding people who are blind, alerting people who are deaf, pulling a wheelchair, alerting and protecting a person who is having a seizure, reminding a person with mental illness to take prescribed medications, calming a person with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) during an anxiety attack, or performing other duties. Service animals are working animals, not pets. The work or task a dog has been trained to provide must be directly related to the person's disability. Dogs whose sole function is to provide comfort or emotional support do not qualify as service animals.

Service animals must be house broken, controlled with a restraining device, display appropriate behavior at all times while on our property. Guests whose service animal demonstrates aggressive and/or inappropriate actions toward a Guest or Associate will be directed to remove the animal from the park. There is a limit of one service animal per Guest.

We are not permitted to take control of your service animal. Service animals are not permitted in water attractions, wet decks, wading pools or rivers.

A service animal relief area is located in the grassy area next to gazebo at the Front Entrance. Please look for the designated sign. Owners are responsible for disposing of their animal's waste.



### **Special Dietary Needs**

Although outside food and beverages are not allowed in the park, individuals who have special diets or need items due to a medical condition may bring small coolers to accommodate such needs. Please visit Guest Services for more information.



### **Wheelchairs & Electric Convenience Vehicles**

Although outside food and beverages are not allowed in the park, individuals who have special diets or need items due to a medical condition may bring small coolers to accommodate such needs. Please visit Guest Services for more information.

## **GUESTS USING WHEELCHAIRS & ECV'S**

Guests who choose to use a wheelchair or ECV must maintain a safe speed while traveling in the park. Wheelchairs and ECV's cannot be accommodated on most attractions. Please refer to the individual attraction description in the back of this brochure for more specific information. On most attractions where Guests in wheelchairs can be accommodated, Guests will need to leave their wheelchairs to be seated. In most cases, a wheelchair may be left in a designated position on the walkway near the attraction. If in doubt about your ability to safely experience an attraction, we urge you to consult with our staff at White Water Bay. Six Flags Great Escape Lodge personnel are not trained in transferring Guests from wheelchairs to ride units and are not permitted to do so. You should plan your visit with someone who can physically help you when necessary.

Walkers, canes, or other assistive devices are permitted only at ankle depth in the following attraction(s) Tak-It-Eesi Creek, Tall Timbers Treehouse, and Tip-A-Kanu Beach.

During your visit, please speak to a member of our Aquatics Supervisory team to obtain access to the water wheelchair or pool lift and for further accessibility information.

## **EVACUATIONS**

Evacuations may be required due to such causes as a mechanical reason, weather conditions, or a power interruption. If an evacuation is required, Guests may be asked to evacuate pools as quickly as possible using stairs or ladders. If an evacuation from a slide is required, remain seated until given instructions. For safety reasons, we may evacuate ambulatory Guests prior to evacuating those Guests using wheelchairs. If so, you accept any risk due to delayed evacuation or if we need to physically lift or lower you.

## **GUESTS OF A LARGER SIZE**

Due to manufacturer requirements, Guests of a larger size (in terms of height, weight, and/or proportions) may not be accommodated on some of our attractions. Maximum (and minimum) weight limits can be found under the individual attractions in this guide and on the Safety Guide Signs at the entrance to attractions with restrictions.

Maximum (and minimum) weight limits can be found under the individual rides in this guide and on the Rider Safety Guide Signs at the entrance to attractions with restrictions.

## LOOSE ARTICLES

Most attractions cannot accommodate loose articles including jewelry, cell phones, hats, eyewear, cameras, purses, backpacks, beverage containers, electronic devices, etc. Items must be safely secured in a waist pack, in a locker, or with a non-Rider. Six Flags Great Escape Lodge is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged items. Any non-compliance which results in damage or injury to person or property will result in consequences up to and including prosecution.

For safety reasons, cell phone usage, taking pictures, and filming on attractions are prohibited. Glasses must be secured on all rides. On Avalanche, Glacier Run, Snowshoe Falls, and Tall Timbers Treehouse slides glasses must be secured by an athletic strap or they cannot be worn on the slide.

Hearing devices and other electronic devices may be damaged by water. Please take necessary precautions to protect hearing devices on all attractions.

Sensory headphones or helmets may be accommodated on select rides. Please see an Associate for more details. Any non-compliance which results in damage or injury to a person or property will result in consequences up to and including prosecution.

## LOST AND FOUND

All items found at White Water Bay are turned in to the Waterpark Admissions Desk. At park close, items are taken to the Resort Front Desk. If you lose an item on an attraction, we will search for the article as soon as possible. In order to keep the attraction in operation, an immediate search may not be possible. Lost articles may be reported at [sixflagsgreatescapelodge.com/lost-found](https://www.sixflagsgreatescapelodge.com/lost-found).

**For your safety, do not enter unauthorized areas to retrieve lost articles. You can be seriously injured if you enter an unauthorized area.**

## OXYGEN TANKS

Neither portable oxygen tanks nor personal oxygen equipment are permitted on waterpark attractions.

## STROBE LIGHTING & SPECIAL EFFECTS

White Water Bay utilizes special effects, including but not limited to: haze and other atmospheric effects, scents, areas of low lighting, loud music, sound effects, strobe lighting and other specialty lighting. Guests with medical conditions that may be impacted by these special effects are advised not to participate.

## PROPER ATTIRE

Appropriate swimwear is required. Thongs and transparent clothing are not permitted. We reserve the right to determine the appropriateness of swimwear. Guests wearing bathing attire with metal buttons, rivets, zippers, or snaps will not be permitted to ride any of our slides. Jewelry including but not limited to, necklaces, bracelets, dangling earrings, and rings other than wedding bands are prohibited on Boogie Bear Surf. For your safety, loose clothing (including scarves and other free-flowing clothing) must be significantly secured or removed to prevent any interference with the ride experience. Hearing devices or other electronic devices may be damaged by water. Please take the necessary steps to protect such items. Contact lenses are not recommended. Guests requiring special accommodation should speak to a member of the Aquatics Supervisory Team.

## SWIM DIAPERS

Guests who require a diaper are required to wear swim diapers or a diaper specifically designed for aquatic use.

## RIDER CRITERIA

Our Attraction Accessibility Program is designed to allow Guests to participate in the enjoyment of our attractions as much as possible. The program was developed by analyzing the physical and mental attributes required to safely participate each attraction. It is our policy to allow anyone to participate who meets all these requirements and is not a hazard to themselves or others. We continue to evaluate and update our Attraction Accessibility Program as necessary.

The evaluation of each attraction considered the following criteria:

**Independent seated postural.**

*The Guest must have the body and spinal control to sit upright without the aid of other people or devices. The Guest must also have sufficient muscle control to support their head, neck, and upper torso during the course of the ride, including the dynamic motion of the ride.*

**Appropriate center of gravity.**

*The Guest's body must have the appropriate weight distribution for that ride.*

**Ability to hold on with one functioning arm.**

*Guests must have one functioning arm that exhibits good grip control, the ability to brace, and is strong enough to allow the Guest to maintain proper riding position throughout the duration of the ride. A functioning arm may be a natural arm or a prosthesis which can be used for gripping and bracing. Any arm prosthesis must remain properly secured under the dynamic forces of the ride. Due to manufacturer requirements, some rides may exclude prostheses.*

**Ability to hold on with two functioning arms.**

*Guests must have two functioning arms that exhibit good grip control, the ability to brace, and are strong enough to allow the Guest to maintain the proper riding position throughout the duration of the ride. A functioning arm may be a natural arm or a prosthesis which can be used for gripping and bracing. Any arm prosthesis must remain properly secured under the dynamic forces of the ride. Due to manufacturer requirements, some rides may exclude prostheses.*

**Ability to brace self with one functioning leg.**

*Guests must have one functioning leg to be used for bracing the body during the course of the ride. A functioning leg may be a natural leg or a prosthesis used for bracing the body during the course of participation and maintaining balance when entering and exiting a ride unit. Any leg prosthesis must remain properly secured under the dynamic forces of the ride. Due to manufacturer requirements, some rides may exclude prostheses.*

**Ability to brace self with two functioning legs.**

*Guests must have two functioning legs to be used for bracing the body during the course of the ride. A functioning leg may be a natural leg or a prosthesis used for bracing the body during the course of participation and maintaining balance when entering and exiting a ride unit. Any leg prosthesis must remain properly secured under the dynamic forces of the ride. Due to manufacturer requirements, some rides may exclude prostheses.*

**Minimum of two functioning extremities.**

*Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities (two legs, two arms, or one arm and one leg) to brace themselves during the ride and assist in entering and exiting the ride unit.*

**Minimum of three functioning extremities.**

*Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities (two legs and one arm or two arms and one leg) to brace themselves (with tripod bracing) during the ride and assist in entering and exiting the ride unit.*

**Minimum of four functioning extremities.**

*Guests must have four functioning extremities (two legs and two arms) to brace themselves during the ride and assist in entering and exiting the ride unit.*

**Ability to enter/exit ride within specified parameters without endangering self or others.**

*Guests must be able to enter and exit the ride without jeopardizing themselves or others and to assist with their own evacuation, if necessary. This may include special arrangements such as entering through the Alternate Access Entrance or having someone aid in boarding. For the safety of our Associates and Guests, Associates are instructed not to perform any lifting of Guests.*

**Appropriate observed behavior:**

*Guest demonstrates appropriate observed behavior indicating a willingness and ability to participate and/or follow Guest requirements. Appropriate observed behavior may include, but not be limited to maintaining proper riding position, attention and compliance to safety instructions, proper use of all ride safety equipment and willingness to participate.*

**Guests have a duty to:**

- Exercise good judgment
- Act in a responsible manner while using waterpark attractions
- Not participate while under the influence of alcohol or drugs
- Properly use all ride safety equipment provided

## WATERPARK ATTRACTIONS

The following descriptions are designed to give you information on the types of actions caused by various rides. Each of the following attractions will identify the restrictions according to the criteria outlined on page 8. **In order to participate on most attractions, Guests must have seated postural control, appropriate center of gravity, appropriated observed behavior, and the ability to enter and exit the attraction safely.**

Specific exceptions or qualifications to those four criteria will be noted in the information provided below. Please use caution when entering and exiting waterpark attractions as the surrounding areas may be slippery. Conveying devices, such as tubes and rafts, may be slippery and can shift during loading and unloading.

### Avalanche 4



Guests must be at least 42" tall to ride alone **or** guests between 36" and 42" tall must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion

Maximum Weight of 800 lbs per raft.

Avalanche is a Family Raft Ride designed to carry two to four Guests. Avalanche allows families to experience the excitement of riding down a dark tube together. The darkness inside the slide, along with the speed, keeps the Riders in suspense as they can only guess what comes next. The slide's gradual decline and many twists and turns help to push the tube along at a high rate of speed. Ultimately, the Riders splash down at the bottom of the hill into a catch pool.

**Rider Criteria:** Riders are required to maintain the proper riding position – sit up straight, with their hands and legs inside the raft, holding on to the handles at all times. When there are TWO Riders, ensure the heavier guest sits on the back of the raft. Hand-held Infants are not permitted to ride slides. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, forearm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

**Rider Access:** Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs. Riders will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the raft, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the raft may shift. The raft and surrounding area may also be slippery.

### Boogie Bear Surf 4



Guests must be 42" tall in bare feet to participate.

Endless sheet of water that Riders lay down on a body board and slide down the wave surface. Maximum water Depth 4".

**Rider Criteria:** Guests must lie down headfirst, on stomach with torso in contact with the board, while entering the attraction. Once on the attraction, guests may ride with one or both knees in contact with board. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, or broken collar bone are not permitted to ride. Casts are not permitted on this ride.

**Rider Access:** Access to each section of the attraction requires guests to step up to the entrance flume area and enter head first on the board. Riders will have to transfer to a board, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the area may be slippery.

**NOTE:** Loose articles are not permitted, including, but not limited to, piercings, necklaces, and rings.

### Glacier Run and Snowshoe Fall 4



Guests must be 40" tall to ride.

Maximum weight of 250 lbs.

Individual tube ride with banked turns and drops ends in an 18" deep catch pool.

**Rider Criteria:** Guests must remain seated in the tube facing forward and holding onto the handles. Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, forearm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

**Rider Access:** Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs with a tube. Riders will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the tube, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. ## Lott-A-Watta Bay 1



Children must be 42" tall in bare feet to ride alone **or** be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Children under 48" tall in bare feet or those who are inexperienced or non-swimmers are required to wear a life jacket. A Supervising Companion may accompany up to two children.

Lott-A-Watta Bay is a 1,450 square foot play area directly connected to Tak-It-Eesi-Creek.

**Rider Criteria:** Guests must be able to maintain independent seated postural control and must have appropriate observed behavior or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

**Rider Access:** Access is available via the stairs. Riders will have to transfer to the stairs, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the area may be slippery.

## Soakum Springs 1



Guests must be 18 years or older to use this attraction.

Maximum 10 guests.

A large indoor spa. Maximum water depth is 36". Please observe reasonable time limits.

**Rider Criteria:** Guests unable to maintain seated postural control, have the ability to safely enter and exit the pool, or demonstrate appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held Infants may not participate.

**Rider Access:** Access is available via the stairs. Riders will have to transfer to the stairs, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

## Tak-It-Eesi Creek 1



Children must be 42" tall in bare feet to ride alone **or** be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Children under 48" tall in bare feet or those who are inexperienced or non-swimmers are required to wear a life jacket. A Supervising Companion may accompany up to two children.

A slow-moving river tube ride/attraction.

**Rider Criteria:** Guests must be able to maintain independent seated postural control and must have appropriate observed behavior or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

**Rider Access:** Access is available via the zero-depth entry. Riders will have to transfer to a tube on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

## Tall Timbers Treehouse 3



Riders must be at least 40" tall to ride the Blue, Green and Orange Slides. Guests over 54" are not permitted to ride the Red Slide.

A three-story water fortress with interactive activities including water sprayers, a huge bucket that dumps water, and waterfalls.

**Rider Criteria:** Guests are required to lie down on their back, feet first, with arms crossed across their chest and legs crossed at the ankles. Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Hand-held Infants must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, or broken collar bone are not permitted to ride. Casts are not permitted on the slides.

**Rider Access:** Access to the attraction requires climbing a few flights of stairs. Riders will have to be capable of safely entering the slide, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

## Tip-A-Kanu Beach 2



Guests must be less than 54" tall in bare feet to ride **or** be accompanied by a child. Guests over 54" tall are not permitted on the slides.

An interactive pool for children which features slides, other play elements. Maximum water depth is 12".

**Rider Criteria:** Guests are required to slide upright or lying feet first. Guests who do not have seated postural control or appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held Infants must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

**Rider Access:** Access to the attraction requires climbing several rope steps. Riders will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the slide, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.
